What is the Context?

- Matthew 13:1-9 Parable of the sower/soils
- Matthew 13:10-19 The question: why parables?
- Matthew 13:20-23 Explanation of the parable, the understanding of the parable, the meaning of the soils

Matthew 13:13-15

- 13 This is why I speak to them in parables, because.... seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand.
- 14 Indeed, in their case the prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled that says: "You will indeed hear but never understand, and you will indeed see but never perceive."
- 15 For this people's <u>heart has grown dull</u>, and with their ears they can <u>barely hear</u>, and their eyes they have <u>closed</u>, lest they should see with their eyes and **hear** with their ears and **understand** with their heart and turn, and I would heal them.

- Turn towards;
- To turn around;
- To bring back, convert

iaomai

- To heal, cure
- To heal, spiritually, restore from a state of sin and condemnation

Seeing *blepO* verses 13x2, 14b, 15b, 16a, 17a 1x

- To have the facility of sight
- To exercise sight, to see
- To look towards or at
- To face
- To take heed
- To cast a look onto see, behold
- To observe
- To discern mentally, perceive
- To guard against
- To be an object of sight, be visible

Eyes... Closed ophthalmos ...kammyO

verse 15a

• To shut, close the eyes

Hear *akouO* verses 13x2, 14a, 15b, 16b, 17b 13x, 18, 19, also 23

- To hear, harken, listen to
- To heed, obey
- To understand
- To take in or admit to mental acceptance

Barely Hear bareOs akouO verse 15a

- Heavily
- With difficulty, dully, stupidly

Understand (with their heart) syniEmi verses 14a, 15c, 19a, also 23

- To understand, comprehend thoroughly
- To perceive clearly
- To be well judging, sensible
- To be spiritually intelligent
- To be religiously wise
- Realize, understand

Perceive, (longed) to See *horaO*

verses 14b, 15b "should see with their eyes" 17b x2 (1st & 3rd "see")

- To see, behold, look
- To visit
- To mark, observe
- To be admitted to witness
- To be admitted into the more immediate presence of God [Mt 5:8; Heb 12:14]
- To obtain true knowledge
- To see a thing
- To appear, to reveal oneself
- To present one's self

Heart has grown Dull *kardia pachunO* verse 15a

- To fatten, make gross
- To be rendered gross, dull, unfeeling

Matthew 13:16-17

- 16 But blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear.
- 17 For truly, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it.

Search for Understanding!

- What did the disciples **do** to change their **hearing** to **understanding**?
 - They realized they did not get it the first time
 - They asked questions
 - They stuck around for the explanation!
 - •They realized to see & hear is not enough—we must seek to **understand**!

What must we do to gain understanding?

Dig Deeper!

• Ask questions:

- What is the **context** (verses before, verses after, where else does the Bible cover the topic or event?
- Who was the **author**? Who was the **audience** (person, church, area)?

(after Christ's resurrection/Pentacost)?

- What **type of book** (Law, poetry, history, prophesy, letter)? What was the **culture** at the time it was written?
- What do I need to **Obey**? What **principles** do I need to understand?
- What changes do I need to make to grow as a Christian: today, this week, this year?
- **Revisit the verse!** Don't be satisfied by hearing a verse read or a quick reading of a PowerPoint slide. **Take notes** to study on other days besides Sunday!
- Read it in **another translation. Paraphrase** the passage in your own words.
- Memorize the verse (or put it on a card)—to defend against the fiery arrows of Satan!
- Apply the concepts! Put it into practice!
