Luke's Goals Align New Readers

- Set a Foundation of Knowledge for new Christians
 - Understand the Life of Jesus
 - Understand the start of the early church
 - Understand Christian Faith

The Author and Audience

- Luke, the Gentile physician
 - Luke 1:1-4
 - Strives to write an orderly account of the events he witnessed.
 - Draws from eyewitness testimony and careful investigation
 - Colossians 4:14; Philemon 1:24
 - Gentile physician and a companion of the apostle Paul
- Audience included both Gentile and Jewish readers
 - Desire to present the gospel message in a way that would appeal to a diverse audience

The Humanity of Jesus

- Stories of Compassion and Empathy
- Luke 4:16-21
 - Seek the poor, brokenhearted, captives and ignorant
- Luke 7:36-50
 - Jesus kept company with sinners who sought him.
- Luke 19:1-10
 - Jesus kept company with corrupt and rich officials

The Humanity of Jesus

- Healer and Miracle Worker
- Luke 4:40-41
 - So many healed after a long sabbath day
- Luke 8:22-25
 - The winds and waves obeyed him

The Savior of All

- Luke 2:8-11 Birth of Jesus is Good News to All
 - Remember Luke 19:10
 - All people: regardless of ethnicity, social status, or religious background
- Luke 14:15-24 Parable of Jesus Teaching Inclusion
- Luke 15:1-7 Mission to Seek and Save the lost
 - Remember Luke 4:16-21
 - Seek the poor, brokenhearted, captives and ignorant
- Luke 24:44-53 Jesus's Final Moments
 - Inviting all people to come to Jesus and receive forgiveness, redemption, and new life

- Acts 8:1-4 Expansion of the Gospel From Jerusalem to Judea and Samaria
- Acts 11:19-26 Further expansion into Tarsus
 - First called Christians in Antioch

 - The foundation of the church and the story of its growth
- Accounts by the Witnesses to the Resurrection
 - Acts 1:9
- The Gospel was spread preaching his resurrection
 - Acts 2:32
- Our mission to spread the gospel is demonstrated with many examples.

 - Acts 10: 9-16 Vision of Animals to Eat
 - Acts 10:34-35 God shows no partiality
- Perseverance in the Face of Opposition
 - Acts 5:27-29 Obey God rather than men
