**1Th.5:9-22** — For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. Therefore **encourage one another** and **build one another** up, just as you are doing.

We ask you, brothers, to **respect** those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. And we urge you, brothers, admonish the idle, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with them all. See that no one repays anyone evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to everyone. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies, but test everything; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil.

## Major *Purpose* for the Assembly is **Encouragement**

- Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.
- Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. Heb. 10:19-25

### Stir Up — Encourage

- to meet together epi-synagōgē the act of being gathered together or being assembled
- as is the habit of some, but encouraging parakaleo 109x
  - To call for, invite to come, send for
  - To call upon, exhort, admonish, persuade
  - To beg, beseech, entreat, implore;
  - To animate, encourage, comfort, console,
  - To be cheered, comforted

### What Encourages You?

#### Some of what encourages me...

- People showing up, being in the assembly
- See the **young** stepping up, showing initiative, making faith their own
- The faithful consistency of the elderly, in spite of aches and pains, or weather
- Participation in Bible class, coming prepared, offering thoughtful comments or questions
- Someone sharing what they have been studying
- Good singing, singing favorite songs
- Heart-felt prayers
- When people share answered prayers,
  trials they overcame

- Someone sharing deep insights at the table, their perspective
- Someone sharing a verse that I had forgotten, or sharing their personal impact or perspective
- Learning more about someone's conversion story, where they came from, what led them to the decision
- Watching the **baptism** of a new convert
- News of someone I knew awhile ago, who has remained strong in the Lord
- Seeing my children and grandchildren children growing in the Lord, studying on their own, asking thoughtful questions
- Someone sharing what encourages them!

## Personal Responsibility

Based on Early Church Practice

"What then, brothers? When you come together, each one has a hymn, a lesson, a revelation, a tongue, or an interpretation. Let all things be done for building up." — 1 Cor. 14:26

## Personal Responsibility 2

- "...be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ." Eph 5:18b-21
- "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Col. 3:16-17

## Be A Participant Not A Spectator!

- How do you prepare for the Assembly?
  - Do you consider the specific **people** you need to encourage, to cheer on, or influence?
  - Do you think of some encouragement you can share (song, psalm, verse, victory, joy, thanksgiving, wisdom, or proverb)?
  - Do you consider the prayer list (e.g., to let them know you are praying, to ask about the progress or answers, or to offer some consolation or comfort)?
- Do you leave early enough to arrive on time (or maybe a little early to allow time to greet people)?
- Do you reach out to visitors to make them welcome?
- Did you prepare if you have a service to perform in the assembly?
- If you can't serve when scheduled, then did you find a substitute?

## Make every effort to encourage one another!

- Do you encourage those who volunteer to teach, speak, and serve?
  - Are you taking advantage of the Bible class hour?
  - Do you prepare (read ahead, study at home)?
  - Do you tell the leader how you are studying the scriptures to confirm what they have said?
  - Do you share or demonstrate how you are applying the teachings?
- Do you encourage those who serve behind the scenes (cleaning, preparing, offering, classrooms, bulletin, leading activities, visiting, etc.)
- The command to encourage applies to everyone, even without a preacher or evangelist!
